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Georgia - I William Griffen of the County
Early County and State aforesaid, do make
and publish this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following.
Item 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Be-
linda Griffen lot of land Number one hundred &
thirty in the 28th district of Early County on
which I now reside with all the appurtenances
thereunto belonging, also a Negro Man named
Frank, ~~Adm~~ ^{Approved} a Negro man, Rachel a Negro
Woman, three mules or Horses such as she may
select, five Cow & Calves, six Swine & Pigs, and
all the House hold and Kitchen Furniture
allowing her to divide that with her our child
born as she may see proper To Have and
to hold the above described or named property
for her own proper use and benefit for and dur-
ing her natural life After her death I direct
that such property to be equally distributed

Item 2nd after the payment of my just debts I decree that my children each receive One thousand dollars from my estate except my two youngest Daughters. These I desire to receive Fifteen hundred dollars each after the payment of these several amounts I desire the balance of my estate that may remain to be equally divided between my children and my Wife's children,

Item 3rd In order to facilitate the payment of my just debts I direct that my estate be kept together and worked for the purpose, and the proceeds applied to the payment of my debts. After my debts are all paid I desire the estate to be kept together, and the several accounts as mentioned above to be paid over as my child now becomes of age a Mary. After the latter one shall become of age or Mary then the remainder of the estate as provided for in the second Item be equally divided as therein directed,

Item 4th I request my dear friend John Thomas Griffen, and my Son James D. Coy, to act as my executors to carry into effect this my last Will and Testament, and I hereby constitute them my Executors for that purpose.
