Georgia I William Griffin of no County
Early County and State aforesaid, do make
herein and affix to this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following,
Item 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Be-
linda Griffin lot of land Number one hundred &
thirty in the 28th district of Early County on
which I now reside with all the appurtenances
thereto belonging, also a Negro man named
Frank, ~~Ad~~ a Negro man, Rachel a Negro
woman three miles or thereabouts such as she may
select, Five Cow & Calves, Six Sows & Pigs, and
all the House hold and Kitchen Furniture
allowing her to divide that with her own child
drown as she may see proper to have and
to hold the above described or manut property
for her own proper use and benefit for and dur-
ing her natural life. After her death I direct
that such property to be equally distributed

Item 2^d) after the payment of my just debts I desire that my Children each receive One thousand dollars from my Estate except my two youngest Daughters. These I desire to receive Fifteen hundred dollars each after the payment of more or less amounts I desire the balance of my estate that may remain to be equally divided between my Children and Step Children,

Item 3^d) In order to facilitate the payment of my just debts I direct that my Estate be brought together and worked for the purpose, and the proceeds applied to the payment of my debts, after my debts are all paid I desire the trustee to at still keep together, and the several amounts as mentioned above to be paid over as my Child-
ren become of age. A Mary, after the last
one shall become of age or during their the
remainder of the Estate as provided for in the
Second Item be equally divided as herein
directed,

Item 4^d) I request my Son John Thomas Griffen, and
my Son William Griffen to act as my exec-
utors to carry into effect this my last Will
and Testament, and I hereby constitute them
my executors for that purpose.
