2^d Item I desire and direct that all of my estate both real and personal
be kept together until all my just debts be paid by my Executors
hereafter appointed unless they should deem it necessary to sell off a
part of my Real Estate for the benefit of creditors

3^r Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Terripa Moore for
and during her natural life (but) all of my land in the sum
by eight distinct (8) in said County of Early with the dwelling
house where I now reside also the following named negroes to
wit Hector known as my carriage driver Eliza a woman Diana a
woman Eliza a girl Susan a girl Ben a boy Hannah a woman
Abraham a boy also my carriage and two mule (Hector's Bill) for
her especial Benefit during her natural life the residue to be sold
and equally divided among my following named children to wit
Martha J. Lott wife of William H. Lott James H. Wade John
H. Wade William H. Wade Ruthie M. Wade Dennis C. Moore
John Moore Eliza H. Wade Virginia H. Wade Mary G. Moore

after my wife's life Estate shall cease

I to them I give and bequeath the following sum of £1000.00 to be divided among William H. Lovett and my dear son James H. Wade, John M. Wade, William H. Wade, Nathan H. Wade, Dennis H. Wade, John H. Wade, Eliza H. Wade, Virginia A. Wade, Clay C. Wade, all of my family living in the fifth district of Early County known as my Hixey Creek plantation to be apportioned after all my just debts are paid and equally divided between them share and share alike.

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Mary H. Glavin wife of Thomas J. Glavin Ten dollars to be paid in cash by me executors

I to them I give and bequeath to my daughter Barbara J. Lovett one hundred and one dollars James H. Wade, John M. Wade, William H. Wade, Nathan H. Wade, Dennis H. Wade, John H. Wade, Eliza H. Wade, Virginia A. Wade, Clay C. Wade, all the residue of my property both real and personal who of and whatever it may include to be divided Equally among them all William H. Lovett accounting in the division for Two negro girls valued one thousand dollars now in his possession to paying his debt before that sum until a general distribution take place, also deducting the sum which he retained in the Lands especially appropriaed to him shall be taken at Dennis H. Wade, William H. Wade and Nathan H. Wade to account for the value of a negro girl www.geographioneers.com has received and now in his possession worth four hundred and fifty dollars also the amount of his interest in the Lands especially appropriaed to him shall be valued at Dennis H. Wade, William H. Wade and Nathan H. Wade to account to the younger named children for the amount which their interest in the Lands especially appropriaed shall be valued at giving to each of my younger named children to wit Dennis H. Wade, Nathan H. Wade, Eliza H. Wade, Virginia A. Wade and Clay C. Wade agrees at a fair valuation to make their interest in my Estate Equal to my three older children given in Lands especially appropriaed also that the Expenses of my younger children for education and board be paid out of the General sum until final distribution to be made of all my Estate both real and personal as before apportioned and directed also the sum of Three Thousand dollars be especially appropriated to my three children present & Nedie Eliza H. Wade, Virginia A. Wade, as a fund for their education also the sum of Five Hundred Dollars be especially appropriated for the education of my youngest son Clay C. Wade also when my just debts are paid that my executors do proceed to sell all of my remittable property consisting of horses such as Stock cattle hogs slave carts wagons plantation and blacksmith tools at private or public sale as they shall deem best for the interest of my surviving named children

3rd Item I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Guardian of the person
of my minor children Dennis W. Wade, Judson A. Wade, Eliza H. Wade, Virginia H. Wade and
John H. Wade and Eliza H. Wade

8th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my sons James H. Wade and John H.
Wade Guardians of the property of my said minor children Dennis W.
Wade, Judson A. Wade, Eliza H. Wade, Virginia H. Wade and Eliza H.
Wade

9th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my two sons James H. Wade and
John H. Wade Executors of this my Last Will and Testament
