Deed Of Gift Rob Hudson

I KNOW all men by these presents that I —  
Robert Hudson of Effingham County in the S<sup>d</sup> State of  
Georgia Planter, for and in Consideration of the Natural  
love, good will and affection which I have and do bear to  
my well Beloved Grand Son Maxwell Hudson, And  
for Divers other good Causes, and Considerations, Me the  
Said Robert Hudson hereunto Especially moving, Have  
Given Granted and Conformed, and by these presents I  
give, grant and Confirm Unto my Said beloved gran-  
Son, Maxwell, an Infant, Son and their Apperent  
of Robert Hudson the younger Deceased; One Negro  
Boy Slave Named June About Twelve Years Old.

Now in the Actual possession, being of Robert Hudson  
Relict of the Aforesaid Robert the Younger Deceased;  
To have and to hold the Said Negro Boy Slave named  
June, as aforesaid for ever, To the said Maxwell Hudson  
his heirs Executors, Administrators and Assigns, to the only  
proper use and behoof of the Said Maxwell, his heirs Ex-  
Administrators and Assigns for ever AND I the Said Rob-  
Hudson, the Said premises unto the Aforesaid Maxwell  
his heirs, Executors Administrators and Assigns, Against  
me the Said Robert Hudson my Executors Administrators  
and all and Every Other person & persons whatsoever he  
and will warrant, and for ever defend by these presents,  
In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and affixed my Seal this day of June, in the Year of  
our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty nine, and  
the Independence of the United States of America the  
Thirteenth

Ever, to the Said Robert Hudson my beloved Grand  
Son, as aforesaid his heirs Executors, Administrators  
and Assigns to the Only proper use and behoof of  
the Said Robert Hudson, his heirs Executors, Admini  
strators, and Assigns, for Ever, And I the Said Robert  
Hudson the aforesaid premises Unto the aforesaid  
Robert, Grand Son as aforesaid, his heirs Executon
