Deed of gift, & State of Georgia, To all ^{people} to whom these presents shall come, I Jane Lunday of ^{the} State aforesaid and County of Effingham; Send Greeting Know Ye that I the Said Jane Lunday for and in Consideration of the Natural Love and Affection which I have and ~~do~~ bear unto My beloved Son Theophilus Lunday and Mary: E: Lunday my Daughter of the State and County, aforesaid and for Divers, other good causes and Considerations, me hereunto Moving, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the Said Theophilus Lunday, and Mary: E: Lunday Singular the Negro fellow, ⁱⁿ that is to say, the Negro Wench, Maug to have hold Enjoy and possess the Said Negro Wench, to the Said Theophilus Lunday and Mary: E: Lunday their heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns, to the only proper use and behoof, of them the Said Theophilus Lunday and Mary: E: Lunday, their heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns for ever, and I the Said Jane Lunday Singular the aforesaid Negro, to the Said Theophilus Lunday and Mary: E: Lunday, their heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will Warrant and forever Defend, by these presents. Deed of Gift } To All People unto whom the
presents writing shall Come, I John Nevell Carpenter of
the County of Effingham, and State of Georgia do send
greeting; Know Ye that I the Said John Nevell for
Divers good Causes and Valuable Consideration
me hereunto moving have given and Granted and by
these presents do give Grant and Confirm unto my
Son Jacob Nevell of Great Ogeechee in the County
and State aforesaid all and Singular, that Tract of
Land Containing Two hundred Acres Lying and being
in the State and County aforesaid Bounded on New
Creek, Granted Samuel Carney on the 20. Day of
November 1769 as also Two other Tracts Containing
of Two Hundred Acres Each Tract bounded on
the above Tract Granted Samuel Carney to which
both the Said Tracts, was Granted unto John Nevell
on the Second Day of August 1786, And all the
above mentioned three Tracts of Land Containing
all together Six Hundred Acres, and bounded
as aforesaid, then I do Give and Grant and
Confirm unto my five Children to it Jacob Nevell
(Turn over)
