The Will of Alexander Hughes Deed 1857

State of Georgia ³

Elbert County ³ In the name of God amen

I Alexander Hughes of the County and State aforesaid being
weak of Body but of sound disposing Mind and memory and
being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst I have Thought
and Capacity so to do do make this my last will and Testament
First I Commit my soul into the hands of my Creator who giv it
and my Body to be Buried in a Christian manner

Second I give and bequeath to William P Lambert in Trust for
Daughter Frances M Dubose and her Children whom or to be
Born the following Negro Slaves to wit Dick and his
wife Abby Martin and his wife Adreane with her children
Dennis Westby Harry & Julian Frank & his wife Matilda
with her children William Ben Prudue and others also
Tom and Mariah also The following Tract or lot of Land
Beginning on Broad River and running from thence to a
large Mulberry which I have marked with a cross mark
on the opposite sides and is a short distance above my upper
Field on the river from thence by a straight line to a pin
marked in the same manner as the Mulberry and standing
near the broad river Road between my two upper Fields from

Buryee by a straight line to the Right Corner on William P Rembert's land near the corner of a small Field that I have lately Cleared near the Mineral Spring now all that part of the tract of land on which I live lying above the line here described is the land that I give unto the hands of the aforesaid mentioned Trustee also all the Increase of the above mentioned Negroes along with said property to be kept by said ^{the} Wm P Rembert Trustee held and Kept in Elbert County and Managed for the sole and separate use and maintenance of my Said Daughter & her Children during the natural life of my said Daughter and at her Death to vest in and be Equally divided among her Children and their Heirs.

Third after the payment of my Debts I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Mary all the remainder of my Estate both real and Personal to her and her heirs forever or failure or refusal by Death resignation or otherwise of said Trustee to act in the above Capacity my will is that the Superior Court of Elbert County while setting for Ordinary ~~for~~ appoint some fit & discreet person or persons as Trustee or Trustees to carry out the objects of said Trustee.

Fifth I constitute and appoint the said Wm P Rembert Executor of this my last will and Testament Inter alimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 23rd day of April 1857
