

# Persian Thornton, Will 1854

Elbert County, Georgia Wills 1836 to 1860

State of Georgia In the name of the Lord  
 Elbert County I, Benjamin Thornton heir of the State and County aforesaid  
 being old and somewhat afflicted in body but of sound mind  
 do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and  
 form following, to wit:

1<sup>st</sup> wife was Sarah Wrenett, 2<sup>nd</sup>

Rebecca Upshur,

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I leave unto my beloved wife Rebecca during her life or so long  
 as she may remain where we now live the tract of land wherein  
 I now live containing four hundred and thirteen acres more or  
 less known as the Middleton & Upshur place and at her death  
 or when she moves off and leaves it then I dispose of the same  
 among my children as hereafter directed. I also leave my wife  
 the one half of my cows & hogs, plantation tools; the half during her  
 life. I leave her my buggy, or cart, one yoke of oxen, three head of horses  
 of her choice and whatever furniture during her life and the one half of stock  
 of sheep during her life, and my beloved wife is to have her years support  
 out of my estate in time of her life, and it is further my will that  
 my wife will not have any more land cleared on this tract of land  
 and only have sufficient timber cut to keep up the plantation  
 and as for fine wood they can cut that off of tract of land belong-  
 ing to my wife.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I having given to my son Thomas considerable property and have  
 given considerable money for him and I therefore give to my son  
 Dozier Thornton in trust for any son Thomas four hundred dollars which  
 is all I intend for any son Thomas.

Item 3<sup>e</sup> I give and bequeath unto the children of my daughter Priscilla  
 Hunt deceased Nine hundred dollars to be equally divided between  
 them.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> All the remainder of my estate both real and personal I  
 will shall be divided into Nine shares equally, one of said shares  
 I give to my son Reuben Thornton; one of said shares I give to my  
 daughter Elizabeth Clarkson; one of said shares I give to my son  
 Benjamin Thornton; one of said shares I give to the children of my  
 daughter Priscilla Hunt deceased, to be equally divided between them;  
 one of said shares I give to the children of my son John Thornton  
 deceased to be equally divided between them; one of said shares I  
 give to the children of my daughter Sarah Higgins to be  
 equally divided between them; one of said shares I give to my  
 daughter Mary Alexander; one of said shares I give to my son  
 Dozier Thornton; the one fifth part of the other share I give to  
 my son Dozier Thornton in trust for his sole and separate use  
 of any grand daughter Elizabeth Alice McMull and formerly Thornton  
 the other four fifths of said share I give to be equally divided

between the other children of my son Daniel Thornton deceased, and  
if this is children of ~~my~~ <sup>Elbert County, Georgia Wills 1856 to 1860</sup> ~~my~~ <sup>www.georgia-pioneers.com</sup> son Daniel. the child  
or children to draw the part or share which their mother would  
have been entitled of this share.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I will at the death of my wife that all the estate both  
real and personal be sold & the money shall go to and be divided  
in the same way and to the same persons as directed in the fourth  
Item of this will and I do hereby authorize my Executors to sell the  
lands in order to make divisions of my estate.

I do direct and will that my Executors shall give up to my son  
Thomas all notes Executions or other demands which I held  
against him and not to collect the money from him as I do release  
him from the payment thereof by this will.

I do hereby appoint my son Dugie Thornton Executor to execute  
this my will and Testament. In witness whereof I hereunto  
set my hand & seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of March November 1853


Georgia Court of Ordinary

William Pulliam's Will 1854  
State of Georgia Elbert County

In the name of God Amen!

I, William Pulliam of said State and County being of sound and disposing mind make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I desire & direct that my body be buried in a Christian like manner; my soul I trust will return to God who gave it.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my dear father all my lands during his natural life, also all my negroes are to belong to my father so long as he shall live.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> It is my will that at the death of my dear father that all my estate both real and personal (except John Rayman) be equally divided between my four brothers namely James, George, Matthew E., Joseph S. & Francis M. Pulliam.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath at the death of my dear father my negro boy John Rayman to brother George & son William Mayfield.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I will that Wm H Adams & Thos J. Marswell my legal Executors to carry out this my last Will and Testament this 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1854.

Signed sealed, and delivered in presence and published by William Pulliam as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us the subscribers who subscribed our names hereto in the presence of said Testator.
