this my last Will and Testament, hereby, Revoking all other
Will or Wills heretofore made by me —

Item 1. My Will is that my Just debts be first Paid —

Item 2. My Will is that my Wife Sarah have all my Estate
both Real and Personal, Including a legacy in the State
of Virginia to the amount of two Hundred & fifty or
Three Hundred Dollars to be at her own proper disposal
and do Hereby appoint My Sons William Faulkner
John Faulkner & Peter Faulkner my Executors signed
this ninth day of July one thousand Eight hundred & six
