a forsaide being of sound mind and disposing Memory but Weak in body and Calling to mind the uncertainty of human Existence and the Certainty of death have thought proper to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following to wit as Touching my Spiritual Concerns I resign my Mortal body to its Mother Earth from whence it came to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and appointed my immortal Soul to God who give it Trusting in the Merits of my Redeemer for the remission of all my sins and as Touching my World Estate which it hath pleased God in his great goodness to bless me with I give and dispose of in the following Manner to wit

Item 1<sup>st</sup> let all my Just Debts funeral and burial Expenses be paid

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth C Alexander the whole of my Estate real and personal for use and benefit to have manage and Control during her Widowhood with Liberty of giving off to any of my Children any part or portion of the property that she pleases and when she please so she dont give one Child more than it distributive Share would be of my Estate

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> it is my Will and I do hereby declare it to be so that when my Wife Elizabeth C Alexander dies or Marrys that the whole of my Estate real and personal together with the increase be equally divided between all of my Children after accounting for what they have had before if my Wife should Marry to have Childs part

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son William M Alexander and my Wife Elizabeth C Alexander and my Son George W Alexander my Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others and ratifying and confirming this and this only in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Third day of November 1859

## Joseph Ferrys Will 1860

 Elbert County } In the name of God Amen  
 I Joseph Ferry of the county  
 aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing  
 memory but weak in body and calling to  
 mind the uncertainty of human existence  
 and the certainty of Death have thought  
 proper to make and declare this my last  
 Will and Testament in manner and form  
 following to wit, as touching my spiritual  
 concerns I resign my <sup>mortals</sup> body to its Mother  
 Earth from whence it came to be buried  
 in a decent manner at the discretion of my  
 Executor herein after named and my immortal  
 Soul to God who gave it—Trusting in the  
 merits of my Redeemer for the remission of all  
 my sins and as touching my worldly Estate  
 which it hath pleased God in his great  
 goodness to bless me with I give and devise  
 of in the following manner to wit,  
 Item 1<sup>st</sup> let all my Just Debts be paid funeral  
 and burial Expenses be paid  
 Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
 Judith Ferry one tenth part of all my Estate  
 real and personal  
 Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my son New Ferry  
 after accounting for forty dollars heretofore given  
 one tenth of my Estate real and personal
