In the name of God Amen. I George Wyche of the state of Georgia
 and County of Elbert being in a low state of health but of a sound and
 perfect mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this mortal
 life doe make and publish this my last will and Testament. In manner
 and form following that is to say. first. I give to my beloved wife
 Aggey Wyche the whole of my property excepting one negro fellow
 named Sam. during her natural life or untill my children comes
 of age. and as my children comes of age my wish is for my beloved
 wife to give them such a part of the property as she with the Executors
 thinks nesary or can spare them. also my wish is for my beloved
 wife to raise my children on this property. and after her death the
 whole of the property is to be equally divided Between my children
 my wish is for said to be sold at public sale on twelve months
 credit to pay of my best debts after my best debts is paid my desire
 is for my beloved wife with the Executors to purchas such a
 negroe as they think fit with the balance of the money for the
 use of her and the children. and lastly I constitute and appoint
 David Clarke and Joshua Clarke for Executors to this my last
 will and Testament.

In the name of God Amen -
 I Angus McCurry senr. of Elbert County Georgia. being weak in body, but of sound mind & memory reflecting that death is the certain lot of all men & believing in the Christian religion & in a general resurrection I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried in Christian decency at the discretion of my Executors -
 secondly. I will & bequeath to my beloved daughter Margaret McDonald fifty Dollars & the sum of ten dollars to each of her children herein named, viz. Nancy, Margaret, & Rodrick, and in like manner ten dollars to each of the children of my beloved daughter Sarah Gordon herein named, viz. Mary, Flora, Eleanor, Angus, John, Robert & Margaret & to her son Thomas five Dollars -
 thirdly. I will & direct that after the compliance with my second item all the monies arising from the sale of my property, or the money due me be divided into three equal parts, one of which parts to be given to my beloved daughter Margaret McDonald, and one other equal part to be given to my beloved daughter Sarah Gordon, and the other equal part to be disposed of in the manner following, viz.
