Elbert County, Georgia Wills 1836 to 1880
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Georgia In the name of God Amen.
Elbert County I Isaac Guin of said County and State, and
being of advanced age and knowing that I
must shortly depart this life deem it rite and proper both as
respects my family and myself that I shall make a disposition
of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me
do therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking all other heretofore made by me -

1. Item I desire and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances
and condition in life. my soul I trust shall return to rest with
God who gave it -
2. Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
by my executor herein after appointed -
3. Item I Give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Marthy
all my real estate and personally so long as she shall
live or during her widowhood after my just debts being
paid out of it -
4. Item I Give and bequeath and devise to my son Middleton
Guin Five Dollars, to my son Abner H. Guin Five Dollars,
to my daughter Mary Guin the wife of John H. Johnson
Five Dollars, to my daughter Nancy Caroline the wife of
Nelson Burden Five Dollars to my daughter Delila the
wife of John N. Burden Five Dollars. these sums of money
to be paid out of my property at the division of the estate
and the balance of my estate to be divided amongst
the other named children, Tinsley J. Guin, Thomas P.
Guin, William P. Guin, James A. Guin, Singleton S. Guin,
Henry J. Guin, Martha S. Guin, Sary M. Guin, James W.
Guin, Isaac S. Guin I hereby constitute and appoint
my beloved wife Marthy executrix and my worthy friend
John H. Johnson Executor of this my last will and Testament
this the 16th of July 1847.

I, William Kelly of the state of Georgia and Elbert County being
weak in body but blessed of God with sound mind and
memory have thought proper to make and ordain this my
last will and Testament in manner and form following:
I wish my wife Lucinda Kelly after my death to have
my body decently buried and all of my just debts paid
I will unto my beloved wife Lucinda Kelly all my Estate
both Real and Personal. I have given unto my Sons which
are here named Jas. W. Kelly, David Kelly, and William
Kelly, a certain portion of Property amounting to twenty
Five Dollars each, which is all I design for them. I have also
given unto my Daughters which are named Sarah, Martha,
Philadelphia, Elizabeth Milley, Rebecca, Lucy, and
Rutha, a certain portion of Property amounting to twenty
Five Dollars, each which is all of my Estate that I design
for them. I now constitute and appoint Horatio J. Goff my Executor
to execute this my last will and Testament. I witness I hereunto set
my hand and seal this fifth day of November Eighteen hundred and
