Third. I wish for my wife Mary Parkam to live on my
land and keep all the property together and to raise
and school the children on. During her lifetime. Fourth
I wish after the death of my wife for all of my property
both real and personal to be sold and Equally divided
among all of my children last of all I do appoint my
