In the name of God Amen. James Adams of the state of Georgia
Elliot County be well in health as common & in joying the blessing
of my Reasons & in perfect mind & memory I do make & ordain
this my last will & Testament first my body to the earth &
my soul unto the hands of god who gave it. As touching the
concerns of this world whence with it has pleased god to bless
me in my old age with 3 tracts of land lying in the last
purchase I give & devise & dispose of the same with 2 other
draws as follows first It is my desire & my will to give to
my son John B. Adams who has taken care of me in my old
days my lands as follows the first lot lying & being in
the 15th District of the 3 section & the 24th number of 5th district
& section also the second lot in the 20th District of the 2^d
section the 61st number of 5th district & section also the 3 lot
in the 18th District of the 3 section & the 174th number of 5th district
a gold lot 40 acres with my other 2 draws yet not drawn with
all the land lots or gold lots that I have drawn so I may
draw of any district section or number also it is my desire the
s^d John B. Adams shall have an equal part with my other
children of the rest of my estate. There is William Adams, Samuel
Adams, Ann J. Gaines, Jane Teasley, Elizabeth Seales & John B.
Adams I give an equal share of my estate except those lots &
draws that I have given to my son John B. Adams Also it is my
desire that John B. Adams & Lawrence M. Adams my lawful
executors to this my last will & Testament to & by these presents
I do ratify & confirm & ordain this my last Will & Testament
revoking & abounding any & all other bequests or will by me in any
wise made here before in witness whereof I have set my hand & seal
this the 26th of February 1835.

dead for body to be buried in a neat and churchlike
manner. as my executors hereinafter named may think proper
and the expenses of the same to be paid out of my Estate
Item 2nd. I have given to my son James A. Banks dec'd. William
L. Banks dec'd. Nathaniel Banks and my daughter Liza
N. Harper. Martha A. Crawford and Hannah F. Oliver
dec'd. about three thousand dollars in cash and property
which is all I wish them to have of my Estate. Item 3rd.
I wish my son Francis A. Banks to remain on the plantation
where I now live. and keep the whole of my property together
and with the proceeds of the crops pay off my just debts.
