James Brauner Will

Georgia I James Brauner of said County and State being
Elbert County 3 of sound mind and disposing memory though in
bad Health do make ordain and publish the following to be my
last will and Testament

First I direct all my just debts to be paid 2^d I give to my
wife Janima W. Brauner absolutely to do with as she pleases
all or as much as she wants of my house hold and Kitchen
Furniture 3^d I give to my nephews William M. Brauner
and Soncier W. Brauner all my Medicines Medical Books
Surgical Instruments and Shop Furniture that I may dispossess
of 4th I give to my said wife Janima W. Brauner for
her sole and separate use in case she should marry again
all the remainder of my Estate of every sort, what ever real and
personal debts dues and demands for and during her natural
life only my meaning is my said wife is to have all the
said remainder of my said Estate during her natural life
whether she marries or not but if she marries it is to be
during her life her sole and separate property and not subject
to the control of her husband

5th in case my ^{will} Executor should die ~~and~~ it becomes necessary to have
an Administrator cum Testamento annexed to execute this will
then I here give and invest such administrator with the same powers,
privileges and discretion and title that my Executor has under
this will for the purpose of carrying out ~~this will~~ the same into
full effect 6th I presume the money owing to me will more than
pay ~~my~~ debts I owe but in case there should be deficiency then my
Executor shall have discretion to raise the balance by sale of my
real estate or hire of my negroes as security to him best for the convenience
of my wife 7th If after my debts are paid off a part of
my Estate should remain in the shape of cash I direct my

My Executor to have control of the same and invest it in

 wife 10th I give my Executor power to put any of my negroes
 to a trade if he sees proper but whatever profits accrue from
 their labor he must pay to my wife if put to a trade during
 her life 11th I nominate and appoint Thomas W Thomas to be
 Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
 all other wills by me heretofore made in ~~testimony~~ whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7th day of June in
 the year 1855
