James Carpenter Will 1858

Georgia In The Name Of God Amen  
Elbert County I James Carpenter of Said County and who  
being of sound and disposing mind and a  
Memory and in Solarable Health as to body but calling to mind the  
The uncertainty of life even in The Young and Strong do make  
and publish my last Will and Testamant in manner and  
form following

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I direct all my just Debts to be paid without delay  
if I should owe any thing at the time of my Death

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I will and direct that all my property real & personal

Debts dues and demands of every kind whatsoever shall  
be Equally divided between my wife and all my lawfull

Children borned or to be borned Share and Share alike

That is to say this Equal Division Shall be made at the  
time in the manner and under the restrictions and limitations  
hereinafter to be mentioned and first all my  
children who are of lawfull age or Marriad at the time  
of my Death Shall as soon there after as it can be conveniently  
done draw their Share of my estate and those who at my death  
are still under lawfull age and unmarried Shall draw  
Shares respectively as they come of lawfull age or Marry

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I have given off to my son in law James Hopkins

Four Six Negroes to wit a Negro man Boston valued  
at nine hundred Dollars a woman Maria about 18  
Years Old and her Two Children Westley 3 Years Old  
and Sally about 14 years Old The Three Valued at  
Twelve hundred Dollars Mary 11 years Old Valued  
at six hundred and fifty Dollars Henry about 10 years  
old Valued at six hundred Dollars also a Horse and Saddle  
Valued at one hundred and Eighteen Dollars all the above  
Named Negroes being prime Negroes of the first quality  
Now before my said Son in law Shall draw his share of  
my Estate he Shall account for and be charged with the  
above named Advancements at the several times aforesaid  
there to by me and he or any other of the legatees provided for

in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Item of this Will who shall receive any thing herein in  
in the way of Elbert County Georgia Wills 1836 to 1860 which shall be entitled for  
and be charged with the same when they come to get their shares  
respective shares under said 2<sup>nd</sup> Item and in charging my said  
legatees with Negroes or manumitting off Negroes to whom when they  
severally come to draw their shares of my Estate such Negroes shall  
be charged and put not at the market price they may be  
worth here after when they are divided off but such Negroes  
shall be charged at the valuation and in proportion to  
the valuation I have here in put on the Negroes given to my  
son in law James Hopkins Brewer.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> all the valuation of Negroes and other property herein  
before prescribed or hereinafter to be prescribed shall be  
done by three disinterested persons to be appointed by the  
Ordinary of Elbert County and within each of my aforesaid  
legatees shall come to draw their proportion of my Estate  
I will and desire that the child proposing to draw his or  
her share on the one part and my Executrix on the  
other part will agree as to what property any such  
child shall take his or her share in but if they cannot  
agree the matter shall be decided by three disinterested  
persons to be appointed by the Court of Ordinary of  
Elbert County.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I will and direct that my wife disposed of as pro-  
vided for in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Item of this Will concerning my Estate  
shall be kept together and managed and controlled  
by my Executors for the benefit of the parties in ~~but~~  
that each Legatee drawing his or her share as  
herein before provided for when the appointed time  
comes and the balance of the shares remaining undi-  
vided are to be kept with my wife's share for her  
benefit and the benefit of the younger children  
remaining with her and my Executors are to provide  
for the family so remaining out of the annual  
crops in the same manner that I now provide  
for my wife and children and the said Executrix  
are to pay over to my said wife annually two  
hundred dollars out of the crops over and above her  
support hereinafore provided for and over and above  
her equal share of my Estate this sum of two hundred  
dollars being intended for her pocket money

Item 6<sup>th</sup> the property herein bequeathed to my wife except

The Two hundred and ~~thirty~~<sup>Elbert County, Georgia Wills 1838 to 1860</sup> To her for her life time  
only and after her death the same is to be equally  
divided between all my children and their legal representatives

I have the my home place nor any part of it shall not be  
sold for any purpose as long as my wife chooses to live  
there and remains a widow but if she thinks proper  
to move from there or to marry then she shall take a  
her child's part of my estate during her life and the  
Two hundred dollars annually and no more of my estate  
Item I nominate and appoint my wife Eliza Harris  
and my son William J. H. and my son in law  
James Hopkins Brewer Executrix & Executors of this my  
last Will and Testament my said son William J. H.  
Not to qualify until he is Twenty one years of age  
and I recommend to them to take for their legal advisor  
Thomas W. Thomas on all matters connected with my estate  
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand &  
Seal this 21<sup>st</sup> March 1853

I James Carpenter being of sound mind and in  
good health do make this for a codicil to the foregoing will  
not revoking the same except where it is altered by this codicil  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> I have given to my son in law James Hopkins Brewer  
Lands and Negroe including and containing in the  
Negroes here before charged to him the sum of Ten Thousand  
Six hundred and Twenty Dollars also one Horse Saddle  
and Gray Billy Worth one hundred and Seventy five dollars  
also Five Head of Horned Cattle worth five dollars per head  
also 2 Beds bedsteads & Kitchen Furniture Worth Seventy five  
dollars 25 Head of Stock Hogs worth one dollar per head  
I have given to my son William J. H. \$25000

Hundred and fifty Dollars in Lands and Negroes also one house  
Worth worth one hundred dollars also one horse worth  
one hundred and Twenty Dollars also 13 head of horned Cattle worth  
five dollars per head 25 head of Stock Hogs worth one dollar per  
head one Milke Steers worth forty dollars 2 Sicks Bedding and a bed  
Steads Worth Sixty dollars the above and foregoing To be accounted  
for by my Said Son in law and Son as advancements as prescribed  
in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Item of the will those and all other advancements which I  
mean are to be accounted for with out interest and in other  
respects as the law prescribes provides in cases of intestacy  
Item 2<sup>nd</sup> when I prescribe in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Item of this will how each  
Child shall draw his or her Share of my Estate I do not mean  
that each shall draw as much as I have given to my Son in law  
and Son if by any mis fortune or otherwise my Estate shall  
not be sufficiently large at the time of drawing to give  
each Child not provided for by me and my wife that  
Much but each Child or my wife who or she draws shall  
only take his or her equal Share of what may be my  
Share Estate at the time

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> my will is that a long as my Children are under age  
& unmarried they shall not be charged for a Support  
& such Education as I have heretofore Given my Children  
Item 4<sup>th</sup> I appoint my Son Thomas J to be Executor of this  
Will with his mother and Brother William in place of  
James A Brewer my Son in law not because I lack any  
Confidence in my said Son in law but because I wish  
my Son to have it in preference to my Son in law  
and I dont want too many Executors in Testimony  
Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 3<sup>rd</sup>  
February 1838
