Georgia Elbert County. Decr. 15th 1837. In the name of God. I James F. Nunnellee ther. being of sound mind and knowing the uncertainty of life do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills, here tofore made by me.

1^{stly}. I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executors who will here after be named.

2^{ndly}. I will that my present crop of cotton be sold and the proceeds appropriated to the payment of my debts according to the first item 3^{rdly} I will that my present crop of corn, fodder oats & the stock of cattle and hogs be appropriated to the use of my family.

4^{thly}. I leave to my beloved wife Jane Nunnellee the following negroes (to wit); Clarissa a woman. Dick a man. Isaac a large Boy & Patience a girl with all the household & kitchen furniture. two horses of her own choosing also the use of the land whereon I now live during her life or widowhood. at her death or marriage to be equally divided between my children. Willis the heir of Howell the heirs of Charlotte Bentz, Orman. Simeon. Sarah Bottom. Elija Burton. Nancy Burton. Martha Wall. Sophia Mattox. Jane Tolson. & Elizabeth Nunnellee except the land which will be otherwise willed.

5^{thly}. To my son James F. Nunnellee I will and bequeath the tract of land whereon I now live on coody creek adjoining John F. Edwards, Wiley Wall, William H. Richardson & William Rich. containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less with this reservation his mother Jane Nunnellee to live on it during her life or widowhood as above specified and he the said James F. Nunnellee is to take after all the business of the plantation all the plantation tools of all sorts with the wagon, oven, bottle & hogs. I will equally to both he and his mother for the use of the plantation during her life or widowhood & at her death to belong to him the said James F. Nunnellee

6^{thly}. To my daughter Elizabeth. I will three negroes (to wit) Esther a girl Wiley a Boy & Moses a Boy also one peacock bed and furniture one cow & calf & some years schooling if convenient.

7^{thly}. To my son Simeon Nunnellee I will and bequeath one negro Boy Ben

8^{thly}. To my daughter Martha Wall I will and bequeath one negro Boy Peter

9^{thly}. The Balance of my property I will to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between all my children and their heirs except Jane F. Nunnellee. the property one tract of land lying in the twenty ninth District of Elbert county when drawn known by number one hundred & eight containing two hundred two & one half acres. also one tract of land lying in the county of Elbert containing one hundred and three acres be the same more or less adjoining Hugh McGehee John

Watkins and Eras Tate. also one tract of land lying in formerly Cherokee. second section twenty first just; it runs ^{www.georgia-pioneers.com} a man named John a negro man named Charles also one negro man named Tom his wife Maria, a negro woman named Nelly one negro woman named Lresa. also the house not wifed up & one note on account of LaBender for one thousand & fifty dollars due the twenty fifth of December eighteen hundred and thirty seven all to be equally divided between my children except James F. Nunnelee as formerly executed.

15 I fully nominate and appoint my wife Jane Nunnelee & my son James F. Nunnelee my executors to carry this my last will and Testament into effect. In testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and affixed my seal
