State of Georgia & In the name of God Amen.

Elected County & I James Patterson of the State and County aforesaid being  
weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and  
ordain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills by  
me made.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will that all the money which may be due me in debt of  
any description shall be collected and added to the back which may be  
on hand at my death and disposed of as follows: first pay any just  
debts. I then give to the Stewards of the Methodist Church in Elbert  
County, one thousand dollars for the use and benefit of the Methodist  
Church in Elbert County. I give to my friend Robert Brown one thousand  
dollars. I give to my wife twenty five hundred dollars. Then the balance  
of said fund I will shall be divided into four equal shares, one  
of said shares I give to my brother Jonathan, but if not living the  
same shall be equally divided between his children, one of said shares  
I give to my sister Elizabeth; but if she is not living the same shall  
equally divided between her children, one of said shares I give to the  
children and widow of Brother Archibald three children and their  
mother to share and share alike, the fourth or last share I give  
to the children of my sister Sarah to be equally divided between them.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give to my beloved wife Mary all the property which her  
father gave her for her to dispose of as she may think proper.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I leave unto my beloved wife Mary during her natural life or  
widowhood all my lands, negroes, stock of all kinds, horses, mules,  
household and kitchen furniture, provisions on hand and crop  
plantations and other tools and all other property not otherwise  
disposed of in this will, and at her death one half of all the property  
and estate thus bequeathed to her shall be hers to dispose of as she may  
think proper or at her marriage she is to have one half of all the  
property thus bequeathed to her shall be hers in fee simple, and at  
her marriage or death of my said wife the other half of all the  
property thus bequeathed to my wife shall be sold and the money divided  
into four shares, one of said shares I give to the children and widow  
of my brother Archibald to be equally divided between them, one of  
said shares I give to my brother Jonathan and if he is dead to  
his children to be equally divided between them, one of said shares  
I give to my sister Elizabeth and if she is dead to her children  
to be equally divided between them, the other share I give to the  
children of sister Sarah to be equally divided between them.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I do constitute and appoint my worthy friends Robert Brown  
and Middleton W. Hickman Executors to execute this my will

and testament.

twenty five hundred dollars interlined before signed)
