In the name of God Amen this First day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five.

I John Hansard of the County of Elbert being weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks be given unto God the same and called to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die to make and ordain this my last will and Testament willing my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried in a decent Christian like manner and as touching such worldly goods as it has pleased God to bless me with I give and devise in the following manner and form to wit It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of my estate and the balance to be disposed of as follows. I give unto my wife Jane Hansard thirty acres of land more or less it being the tract whereon I now live I also give unto her of my household and Kitchen furniture to dispose of as she shall think proper

I also give unto her my stock consisting of Cows & Hogs and  
plantation tools during the life of the wife equally divided between  
my two sons Lorenzo J. Hansard and Elial H. Hansard. I also will  
my daughter Anna Hansard one dollar or to be paid out of my  
estate. I also will my Corn and fodder to my wife Anna Hansard  
I also will unto my wife Anna Hansard one shot Gun.  
I do nominate and appoint my wife Jane Hansard and  
Jabez Shelton Executor to this my last will and Testament  
giving them full power and authority to act and manage  
my estate according to the time of this my last will &  
Testament and I do hereby revoke and disannul all  
former will and bequeath ratifying and confirming this my  
last will and Testament whereof I do set my hand and  
seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1845.
