I, Mary Stinchcomb of the state of Georgia and county of Elbert being  
 old and infirm in body but of sound mind and memory do make  
 this my last will and Testament (viz) First of all my just debts to  
 be paid. 2<sup>nd</sup> Secondly I give unto my son Levi Stinchcomb all  
 my stock of Hogs and one pine table one sythe and cradle and forty  
 Dollars cash - thirdly I give unto my grand son John Stinchcomb  
 one grey colt. - Fourthly I give unto my son Philip Stinchcomb  
 forty one Dollars in cash - Fifthly I give unto my daughter  
 Betsey Booth one cow and forty one Dollars in cash - Sixthly  
 I give unto my daughter Caty Andrew forty one Dollars in cash  
 and one Brindle heifer - Seventhly I will unto my daughter  
 Francis A. Chambers Forty one Dollars in cash and one Bible  
 Eighthly I give unto my son Nathaniel Stinchcomb Forty one  
 Dollars in cash - Ninthly I give unto my Daughter Lucy M.  
 Hall forty one Dollars in cash and one pine chest. - Tenthly  
 I give unto my Daughter Polly C. Sewell one negro woman called  
 Charity. I also give unto said Polly C. Sewell one grey mare and  
 three head of sheep and one cupboard and one walnut table.

Eleventhly I will that all my household furniture be equally divided between four of my Daughters, to wit, Elizabeth Booth, Katy Andrew Lucy M. Hall and Polly C. Sewell. - Twelfthly I also give unto my said daughter Polly C. Sewell all the goods and chattels not mentioned in the foregoing items. I also appoint Joseph Sewell my Executor to this my last will and Testament.
