

Pickett Shiflet Will 1849

Elbert County, Georgia Wills 1826 to 1860
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State of Georgia & In the name of God Amen.

Elbert County I, Pickett Shiflet of the State and County aforesaid

being of sound and disposing memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of mortal existence and that it is appointed once for all men to die have thought proper to make and ordain this my last will and Testament and first as touching my future estate in a world beyond this resign my mortal body to its mother earth from whence it came and my immortal soul to God who gave it trusting in the merits of my Redeemer for the remission of all my sins and as touching my temporal estate which it hath pleased God in his great goodness to bless me with in this world I give and bequeath in the manner following to wit,

Item 1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid

funeral and burial expences.

Item 2nd It is my will that my beloved wife Lucrecia Shiflet have all my estate both real and personal to have and to hold the same during her natural life and after her death it is my desire that my son James W. Shiflet have a certain tract of land containing three hundred and seventy six acres lying and being in Franklin County whereon the said James W. Shiflet now lives to have and to hold the said tract of land for and during his natural life and after his death the said tract of land to go and be equally divided between all of his children that is now born or may hereafter be born.

Item 3rd It is my desire that my son Lewis R. Shiflet have a certain tract of land containing two hundred and thirty acres lying and being in Elbert County on Pickens creek whereon the said Pickett Shiflet now lives my said son Lewis R. Shiflet to have and to hold the said tract of land for and during his natural life and after his death to go and be equally divided between all of his children that is now born or may hereafter be born.

Item 4th It is my desire that after the death of my said wife that all the balance of my said estate both real and personal except the two tracts of land mentioned be sold by my Executor herein after named and the proceeds thereof be equally divided one half thereof to go to my son Joseph Shiflet and the other half to go and be equally divided between my daughter Eliza Powell's four children to wit Sarah Ann Powell. Noah Powell. Milley Powell and James Powell and if it should so happen that any of the said four last mentioned children should die without issue the surviving ones is to have their part or share.

Item 5th. It is my will and desire that my said wife have the right and authority to use and sell ~~any part of~~ the stock of horses, cattle or hogs, at any time when necessary for the use and benefit of the family.

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Item 6th. I do hereby constitute and appoint Anderson Craft my Executor to this my last will and Testament hereby ratifying and confirming this and this only and renouncing all other and any other instrument whereof I have heretounto set my hand and seal this the thirtieth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine
