imperfect health but of perfect mind and reason knowing
that all men have to by but after death the judgement I
First of all recommend my soul into the hands of God that give it and
my Body I recommend to its mother dust to be buried in decent
Christian Burial and it has pleased to give me a portion of this world
I feel it my duty to dispose of the same as seemeth good to my own view
I first of all make this my last and only will and testament I give and
bequeath to my loving wife Mary Eaves during her natural life four
hundred Acres of Land in the state and county aforesaid and on the
waters of whole Creek and adjoining Upper Eaves and Isaac Ginn and others
and at her death I give it to my two daughters and son Elizabeth Eaves
Judy Ann and Eliza Eaves to be Equally divided and as to my horses
cattle hogs and stock of all kind House hold and kitchen furniture
my above named wife to hold and possess during her life and at her
death to be disposed of in the following manner that is to say
Lunenburg I give one dollar one dollar to the heirs of Catherine Ginn
and one dollar to Mary Bradberry and one dollar to Fanny Roberts
Elizabeth Mason one dollar Nancy Felker one dollar and Susanah
Grady all to be raised out of my personal property above named after
my just debts being first paid the Balance if any left out of the
personal property to be Equally divided between the following Children
William Eaves, James Eaves, Alfred Eaves, Eliza Eaves, and Martha
Brown, Judy Ann Hendrick Sarah Calaway, Loney Calaway, Elizabeth

John B. Gaffney Will 1843.

Georgia John B. Gaffney of the County & State aforesaid did in
 Elbert County the presence of the subscribing witnesses make a verbal or
 nuncupative Will according to the law provided for
 persons that are called to days suddenly or unexpectedly and he the
 said Gaffney being feeble in health but of sound mind and disposing
 memory in his last illness make the following directions concerning his
 property to wit,

- 1st First of all he willed that all of his just and lawful debts should
 be paid out of his notes and accounts that were due the said Gaffney
- 2^d Secondly he willed that Daniel Tate should have and possess all
 the estate that he possessed during the lifetime of him the said
 Daniel and then to his wife Margaret C. Tate while she lives if she
 should out live her husband and at both of these deaths he willed
