Georgia 3 J. Robert Denney of the State and County aforesaid
Elbert County, being weak in body but of sound and reflecting
mind. Knowing that is once appointed for all men
to die do make this my last will and Testament.
I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it, and
my body to the dust from whence it came to buried in
decent Christian burial at the discretion of my surviving friend
As touching the temporal things that it was please God
to bless me with in my life time I dispose of in the following
manner

To wit I wish all my just debts paid out of my estate
My wish and will is that all the property that it has
been please God to bless me with during my life (to wit)
three Hundred and eighty acres of land more or less on Mill
shoal Creek, State and County aforesaid adjoining Lands
Howell Smith, John G. McAlister, Joel Thompson, William B.
Daddy, James Gay and Whithead Hendrick, all my
Stock consisting in Horses, cattle, Hogs, Household and
Kitchen furniture, also my plantation tools of all description
whatever. I give unto my beloved wife ~~that it a~~ Denney
during her natural life time and at and after her
death to be equally divided amongst my five children
to wit, John S. Denney, Elizabeth A. Kiel, William D.
Denney, Frances J. Nelson, James M. Denney.

I do appoint my beloved wife Stetila Denney my
executrix, and son John S. Denney my Executor to this
my last will and Testament.

year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and

David Clark's Will 1846

Georgia In the name of God Amen.
Elbert County I David Clark of the State and County aforesaid
knowing that it is appointed unto men once to die
and being old and feeble yet of sound mind and disposing
memory do now make this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking all others by me made.

Item the 1st I will that my body after death be decently buried
Item the 2nd I will that all my just debts be punctually paid
Item the 3rd I will that that part of my tract of land call'd
Glovers tract lying on the South side of Glover's branch
containing two hundred thirteen and a half acres more
or less also my two lots of land in the first district of
Coweta County No. 301 and No. 304 should be sold and
the money arising from said sale to be equally divided
between my three daughters namely Elizabeth Mathews,
Mildred Willis and Eliza Hudson in as much however as
my daughter Mildred and her husband Thomas J. Willis is now
living on that part of the Glover tract of land and may
keep the same at valuation already made on the same by
William H. Jack John Downer and John Gunter which was
three dollars per acre furthermore my daughter Elizabeth and
husband Philip Mathews has a small part of the same tract
of Glover land enclosed and said Mathews is to have
the same at the aforesaid valuation to wit three dollars
per acre but as the balance of the above named land
in the third Item to wit, No. 301 and 304 in the first district
of Coweta County may not bring money enough to make up
my other two daughters to the same valuation of Mildred's
part they the other two daughters are to be made up equal
