 I Emily Jones of the State and County aforesaid being greatly afflicted and knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death deem it right and proper to make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others theretofore by me made.

Item First - I desire and direct that my body be decently buried.

Item Second - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors.

Item Third - I give and devise to George T. Gallaway heir of Mahulda Gallaway five dollars to be paid by my Executor.

Item Fourth - I give and bequeath to Wiley L. Gallaway five dollars heir of Mahulda Gallaway.

Item Fifth - I give and bequeath to my beloved brother Thomas N. Jones one half of my property, it being his interest in my mother Charlotte Jones estate and my grand mother Jane Jones estate.

Item Sixth - I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Jane Jones one half of my property after paying George T. Gallaway five
