

# STEPHEN CARLTON'S WILL

Elbert County, Georgia Wills 1836-1860

Georgia Elbert County In the name of God Amen. I Stephen Carlton of the state  
of Georgia and County aforesaid being of imperfect health but of perfect  
mind and memory. Knowing that men have to die and after death

the judgment I first of all recommend my soul into the hands of God who  
it and my body to the dust from whence it came to be buried in decent  
Christian Burial. And as to the affairs of this world whereas God has  
blessed me with a small portion of and I have a right to dispose  
of the same as herein set forth to myself and by my own free will with-  
out any bribing or controlling by any person or persons contrary to my  
own mind. I first wish all my just debts to be paid out of my estate  
as I may (herein direct, viz) that is after collecting all the debts that  
are owing to me with all legal affort made by my executors if there is  
a balance that cant be settled otherwise they may sell off a corner  
of the land where they think best to settle the demands against me  
and after they are all settled I give and bequeath unto my loving  
wife Sarah Carlton during her natural life or widowhood all  
my lands and household and kitchen furniture to freely herself  
as follows that is to say as the children marry to give them in  
proportion with them that have married if it can be done without  
material injury to the remainder of the balance with the exception  
of Tom Carlton my son who have had his portion with those that have  
married. and at the general division of my estate those of my  
children that have not had any portion of my estate that is my  
children they are first to have as much as those that are married  
has had before any division takes place and my wish and will  
is for my daughters as they come of age till they marry to remain  
on my lands with their mother till they marry if they can agree and  
sons likewise till they marry if they can agree all while single to  
to work to the advantage of the family in working the land and  
if they after the youngest child Sarah Carlton comes of age believe  
that it will be more to the advantage of the Legatees and with the  
consent of my wife Sarah Carlton they may sell the land and  
equally divide my estate for every child of mine to shear and shear  
alike and if no division till after my wife's death all my children  
to shear and shear alike also provided they Boys shall all leave  
their mother and it was thought that she cold not support on the  
Rent of the land with her own Industry and keep the children  
together in that case with the advise of the executor they will  
be authorized to sell the land and purchase a smaller place  
and apply the balance of the money in the best way for her  
and the childrens support and at her death an equal division

Appoint my son ~~Elbert County Georgia, 1836 to 1860~~  
and last will and Testament and acknowledge the same by my  
own signature and seal in the presence of this 10<sup>th</sup> of March 1841.

## Betsy C. Middleton's Will 1841

State of Georgia <sup>3</sup> In the name of Almighty God Amen.

Elbert County <sup>3</sup> I Betsy C. Middleton of the above named State  
and County being of sound & disposing mind  
memory and understanding praised be god for the same do make  
this my last will and Testament in manner and form following  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> I Give and bequeath to my grand son Dunston B. Verdale for  
the use of my daughter Sally C. Verdale during of her natural  
life Eighteen Negroes and their increase viz a negro man  
named Pepe also a man named Edmund an other man named  
Jack. Polly and her three boys ie Wesley, Winsor & Allen, also  
Charity and her two children ie Jane & her infant not named  
also Prudence & her two children ie Johnson & Rose. Also & her two  
children ie Ben & Nelson. also two girls named Caroline & Millie  
Also my carriage & Harness also my two Horses at Mr. Verdale's  
also one set of Walnut tables & side board and at my daughter  
is to be found divided among all her children.
