Item 4th I give & bequeath to my Sister Mary E. Deadwyler my bed
& Bedstead my large Chest & an brockled Table Cloth

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Sister Sarah P. Deadwyler my
Trunk and cover box & Picture frames & desire that my Executor

herein after named shall purchase out of my money for my
 said Sister Sarah <sup>Elbert County Georgia Wills 1836 to 1860

 above to my Sister Mary E and it is my will that my bed

Will of Rolly Hopper Deed 1857

Georgia I Rolly Hopper of said County do make
Elbert County publish and declare this to be my last will and
Testament

First I direct all my just debts to be paid

Second I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah Hopper all the
household and Kitchen furniture now in about or belonging
to the house where I now live reside and also all the Horses
Cattle hogs and other stock of every description now on or
belonging to the plantation on which I reside and this
property is given to her in addition to what she would
otherwise be entitled to as one of my legatees under this will
and as one of my heirs under the law of the land

Third all the rest of my property I give and bequeath to those
who would be entitled thereto under the law of the land
if I had made no wife

Fourth I wish my debts to be paid out of the property mentioned
in the third item of this will if the same will suffice

before resorting to what is mentioned in the second item

Fifth and I hereby authorize and empower my Executor hereafter named
to sell in his discretion at public or private sale any of the
property herein described or in furtherance of the purposes of this
will

Sixth I hereby constitute and appoint Edmund S Tate of Elbert
County Executor of this my last will and Testament
