Will of William Alexander

State of Georgia In the name of God Amen - I William Alexander Elbert County of the State and County aforesaid being of advanced and knowing that I must depart this life soon it right and proper that I should make a disposition of my property with which a kind Providence has blessed me - I therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me - Item 1st I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner

Item 2nd I desire that all my just debts be paid -

Item 3rd I desire that my beloved wife Anna shall have the Negro boy named David and the Negro girl called Fugah and so much of the Household and Kitchen furniture as may be thought necessary for her comfort, and if she chooses to live on the plantation during her natural all of which at her decease to be disposed of as hereafter mentioned.

Item 4th It is my will and desire that my Executor make sale of account prudent of all my other Estates both real and personal to be disposed of in the following manner, to wits, one equal share to my son George Alexander, and one equal share to my son Robert O Alexander, and one equal share to my son William O Alexander, to be paid to him in money, one equal share to my daughter Nancy Sullivan, one equal share to my daughter Mary O Matt and her children, and do hereby appoint Foley Sullivan and Robert Alexander trustees for my said daughter Mary O Matt and her children -

Item 5th I desire that my daughter Sarah Brown have one dollar in addition to what she has heretofore received

Item 5th At the decease of my wife Anna, it is my will and desire that
the Land, ~~any boy~~^{Elliott County Georgia Wills 1830 to 1850} and household
and Kitchen furniture be immediately sold and divided precisely in the manner
stated in the fourth Item of this Will

Item 6th I do hereby appoint Kelly Sullivan, ~~husband~~ of my daughter Nancy and
my son Robert B Alexander my sole Executors to this my last will and testament
and I do utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former
testament confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament.

I do request my executors to permit my Negro woman Eddy to select her
owner, and give her out of my estate one hundred dollars

I Alexander Hughes of the County and State aforesaid being

being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst I have Thought
and Capacity so to do do make this my last will and Testament

born the following Negro Slaves to wit Dick and his

Beginning on Broad River and running from thence to a
large Mulberry which I have marked with a cross mark

Field on the river from thence by a straight line to a tree
marked in the same manner as the Mulberry and Standing
near the broad river Road between my two upper fields from
