Elbert County County and State aforesaid being of sound mind
and memory but infirm in body and knowing that it
is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and

time or as long as she remains my widow and after the death of
my wife or enter marriage with any other man. I do give and
bequeath to my nephew Benjamin B. Parker junior all the remain-
ing part of my estate. And I do nominate and appoint my wife
Nancy Mervit Executrix and John D. Parker Executor to this my last
will and Testament giving them full power and authority to act
and manage my estate according to the true intent of this my will and

any thing which may be for the peace and comfort of my wife
