Georgia In the Name of God amen
Ellit County I William Moxley of the county and State aforesaid
being much afflicted in body but of sound and
disposing Mind and calling to Mind the Mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die
do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
In the first place, I commend my soul to God who gave
it and my body to the earth from whence it came to be
buried in a decent Christian Manner, And as to such
worldly goods as it has pleased God to best me with I
dispose of in the following manner and from this
First It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of
my Estate and the remainder of my Estate both real
and personal of every kind whatever, except what is
hereafter named, I do give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Polly Moxley during her natural life and after her
death it to be publicly sold and divided amongst all my
Children first Making in amount to those that have
had life with those that have had trust and the same
among equally divide amongst all my Children
It is also my will that my Negro woman Sally and her boy
child Bunkle be sold as soon as convenient after my
death and the proceeds of said sale to be equally divided
between my two sons Franklin H. Moxley and William
B. Moxley to be considered as a part of their portion of
my Estate and I do nominate and appoint my
beloved wife Polly Moxley my Guardian and my son
in law Albert G. Vandervoort my Executor to this
my last will and Testament giving them full power

to act and manage my estate to buy sell barter or any
other act which ^{they} may think will be for the peace and com-
fort of my wife and ^{children} of my estate and
I do hereby revoke and disavow all former wills and
bequests and do ratify and confirm this my last will
and Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this tenth day of August eight-
een hundred and fifty
