State of Georgia } In the Name of God Amen
Elbert County } I William Patterson of the State and
County a free said do make or dain Establish this my
Last Will and Testament
First I will that all my Just Debts be paid Should it
be necessary for my Executor to sell any portion of my
Estate to Carry into Effect this the first Item of my Will
I desire and direct that they sell either publicly or
privately without an order of Court such Property as my
Wife Elizabeth Patterson may point out for this purpose
Second I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth Patterson
my Truffin Place Containing fifty acres more or less bounded
by my old line of the Tract of Land on which I now reside
at her disposal for and during her natural life all my
Estate or the remainder real and personal and mixed of every
Kind whatever and at her death I will and direct
that the same be Equally divided between all my children
those living and the children of those which are dead or may
then be dead the child or children of those which are now

Third I give and bequeath to Jeremiah S Warren in Trust for the use and benefit of my Son Wiley Patterson the Share or Portion which may be going to my said Son Wiley under the Second Item of this Will to be by him the said Jeremiah S Warren Managed and Controlled for the benefit of my said Son Wiley Patterson I also give to the said Jeremiah S Warren as Trustee as aforesaid the Sum of one hundred Dollars over and above the distributive Share or Portion which may be going to my said Son Wiley under the Second or any other Item of this Will to be by him the said Jeremiah S Warren managed and Controlled for the use of my said Son Wiley Patterson this last named as well as the foregoing Legacy I Will to the said Jeremiah S Warren as Trustee as aforesaid at the death of my wife for the purposes named at the death of my Son Wiley Patterson I Will this property and money with its increase to the Legal Heirs of my Son Wiley absolutely and in no case is this said property or money to be subject to debts or liable for the contracts of my Son Wiley

Patterson is to become Inhabited to and have possession of the Land here in given him at the Death of my wife not before (Seventh) in order to Effect this distribution of my Estate on the Death of my wife Contemplated and directed in the Second Part of this Will I desire that those of my Children or grand Children who have received either property or money or both from me in my life time by way of Advancement account for the amount of money or the Value of the property at the time it was given which may have been Advanced to them so that upon a final distribution one of my legatus will not have received more than another except where the difference may arise from the provisions of this Will if any of my Children are now dead or if any hereafter die I will and desire that their Children shall receive their share or portion of my Estate which they would be entitled to were they alive and no more

Eighth I will and desire that my Daughter Mary Griffin or her Children in case they be dead shall not be required to account under the foregoing Terms of this will for any advancements which may have been made to her or her Husband either in Money or property or otherwise but that she and her Children be allowed to share with my other legatus agreeable to the foregoing provisions of this Will without rendering any Account of Advancements as is required of the Others
