Georgia } In the name of God Amen.

Elbert County, } I Zachariah Ozley of the State and County aforesaid being at this time much afflicted in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make and publish this as my last will and Testament -

Item the First: My will is that all my just debt be paid -

Item the Second: I Give and bequeath to my beloved Son Parker Ozley and his heirs at the death of my wife if she should out live me the following negroes to wit, Old Sally Phis and Miles Archy and Bartlett. also the tract of land on which I now live including the tract purchased of William Algood -

Item the third: I Give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Frances Ozley and her heirs at the death of my wife if she should out live me the following negroes Wilson his son young slavers Gilbert also one tract of land containing one hundred & fifty acres more or less ad joining lands to James Duncan -

Item the fourth: I Give and bequeath to David Bell as trustee for my beloved daughter Martha Bell during her lifetime and at her death the property to go to her children this property is to go into the possession of the trustee for the use and benefit of my daughter at the death of my wife if she should out live me the following negroes to wit Martha, Harriet Ann and John and when this property I will and desire to be managed by the said David Bell for the use and benefit of my daughter during her lifetime and at her death to be equally divided between her children but in no event to be subject to the debt of James Bell or to his estate

Item the fifth: I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her life all of my property both real and personal of all description and at her death to be divided between my children as directed So far as the land and negroes are concerned in the previous Items and the balance of my estate not disposed in the previous Items at the death of my wife I Give and bequeath to my Son Parker and my daughter Frances share and share alike

Item Sixth: I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Alice Ozley executrix and my son Parker Ozley executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others by me made at any other time

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen -
Elbert County } I. William B. Powell of the state and County
aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory
and calling to mind the uncertainty of mortal existence and
that it is appointed once for all men to die have thought proper
to make and ordain this my last will and Testament and First
as touching my future estate in a world beyond this I resign my
mortal body to its mother earth from whence it came and my
immortal soul to God who gave it trusting in the merits of my
redeemer for the remission of all my sins and as touching my
temporal estate which it hath pleased God in his great goodness
to bless me with in this world I give and bequeath in the manner
following to wit,

Item 1st It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid
funeral and burial expences &c -
Item 2nd It is my will that my beloved wife Sarah Powell have all
