 tion of the real Estate and Negroes of the late Rowan Johnson
 Deceased among the distributees entitled to said Estate
 we proceeded this day to the performance of that duty there
 were six distributees to wit
 Sarah Johnson widow and relict of said Rowan Johnson
 Deceased Benjamin W Johnson minor heir of said Rowan
 Johnson deceased whose in trust in said distribution were
 represented by Gideon H Kenneday guardian of said
 minor heir Josiah Johnson James Johnson Mosell
 Johnson and Rufus Johnson minor children whose in
 trust were represented in said distribution by Sarah
 Johnson Administratrix of the Estate of said deceased the
 Shares were numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and were ap-
 portioned to the distributees in the following manner to wit the names
 of the distributees was written on a piece of paper and placed
 in a hat the numbers was written on other piece of paper and placed
