The condition of the above obligation is such that if

county deceased do make a true and perfect inventory
of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said
deceased which have or shall come to their hands possession
or knowledge of the said N. C. Berry and David Shuler or
unto their hand possession of any other person or persons
for time and the same so made do exhibit unto the said
court of ordinary when they shall be thereunto required and
such goods chattels and credits do well and truly
administer according to law and do make a true and
true account of these doings and things then
done when there shall be required by the said superior court

or register of probate for the county and all the rest of the goods chattels and credits which shall be found remaining upon the account the same being first allowed by the said court shall deliver and pay to such persons respectfully as are intitled to the same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the said deceased and the same being proven before the court and the executor obtain a certificate of probate thereof and the said J.
