until all debts are paid off

Item 3rd I Give to my wife Elizabeth H. Legg my
Whole Estate both Real & personal during her natural
life and at her death all that may be an hand I be-
queath to my Children Equally

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth H. Legg
my Executrix to execute this my Last will & Testament
