

Letters of Adm. Wm Franklin of Y Davis

State of Georgia By James Vincaid Ordinary of said county
 Fannin County, Young Davis late of Fannin County State
 of Tennessee in which he died resident having lately departed
 this life intestate possessed of a considerable estate real and per-
 sonal and William Franklin Clerk of the Superior Court at
 a regular Term of said court been appointed the administra-
 -tor of the said estate of said Young Davis on condition of
 his giving bond and security according to the direction of the
 said court and taking the oath of office and said William
 Franklin having fully complied with the direction of the court
 This to certify and show that said William Franklin is fully
 empowered & required to do and perform all the duties of
 an administrator of Young Davis to administer according
 to law all the estate of said Young Davis to ask demand
 and recover all said Young Davises claims to pay the debts
 so far as the Estate will extend and the residue pay over
 to the lawful heirs of said Young Davis to make all
 proper returns inventories appraisments and what ever
 other thing as such administrator the law decalves upon
 him in; witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand

State of Georgia I Laten Legg being of sound mind
 Fannin County (and memory but believing that I must
 soon die make this my last will and testament viz First I
 desire that my just debts shall be paid by my Executors hereafter
 named. Second I give and bequeath unto my wife Eliza M. Legg
 during her natural life all my real estate and its appurtenances
 viz. list of land numbers thirty forty four and sixty five all in
 the seventh District and first Section of Fannin County Georgia
 I further desire that my said wife Eliza M. Legg shall have during
 her natural life all of my personal property except as herein after
 named Third I desire that all my estate above given to my wife both
 real and personal be disposed of after her death as follows viz
 If my Executors herein after named can make a satisfactory division
 of the whole property can be made after all my children be com-
 age I desire it so divided so that the heirs can make

the above division it will accord with my desire but if
satisfactory division can be made I desire the property all
sold and the proceeds of the sale be equally divided among
my children I do not want Martha Olsen to have more
to have more than one dollar out of my estate this one dollar
I desire my Executrix herein after named to pay to the said
Martha Olsen and her children

Fourth I bequeath unto my son David D. Legg my Bay mare
bolt about six months old

Fifth I desire my wife to raise Harriet Elizabeth Brown a colt
Six I desire my wife to raise Russel R. Legg a colt

7th I desire my wife to give unto the children that have not had
an equal portions articles to make the gifts all equal

8th I desire my Executrix herein after named to sell lot of land
Number one hundred and fifty one in Davis County Georgia
containing four hundred and ninty acres also Town lot No eight
in the town of Othazanton and such perisable property as my wife
may think that she will not need, sold and the debts coming
to me collected by my Executrix and after my just debt are paid
out of the proceeds of said sale and collected I want the money
loaned out to good solvent persons with security

I hereby appoint constable and appoint my wife Eliza R. Legg my
Executrix to carry out this my last will and Testament
