Know all men by these presents, that Wm. C. Fair principal, East Mosley Security are held and firmly bound unto the Ordinary of said county and his successors in office in the just and full sum of four hundred dollars for the payment of which sum to the said Ordinary and his successors we bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators in the whole and for the whole sum jointly and severally by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 6th day of August 1860

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Wm. C. Fair administrator of the goods chattels and credits of Wm. Stanton deceased late of Chambers County State of Alabama do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of said deceased which have or shall come to ^{the} hands possession or knowledge of the said Wm. C. Fair or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit in to the said court of Ordinary when he shall thereunto be required, and such goods chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law and do make a just and true account of his acting and doing when demanded by the superior court or ordinary and all the rest of the goods chattels rights and credits which shall be found upon account of the said administration the same being approved by the ordinary shall deliver and pay to such persons respectfully as are entitled to the same by law, and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will & testament was read by the said deceased and the same be proved before the Ordinary and the Executors obtain a certificate of probate thereof and the said Wm. C. Fair do in such case if required render and deliver up the said letters of administration then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of William C. Train having fully complied with the direction of the court This is to show that said W.C. Train is fully empowered and required to do and perform all the duties of an administrator of said Stanton to administer according to law all the Estate of said William Stanton to as demand and recover and receive all of said Wm. Stantons Claims to pay the debts of and obligations so far as the estate will extend and the residue to pay out to the lawful heirs of said Wm.
