Floyd County in Barker of said State was born
of Adam and Eve and knowing that I must shortly depart
this life I make this my last will and testament in which I declare
that I do now make a disposition of the property
which a kind Providence has blessed me so therefore make
this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other
hitherto made by me

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a due
and Christian like manner my soul I trust shall return to God who
gave it

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my just debt be paid without
delay by my Executor herein after appointed and am willing
any of my creditors should be delayed in their right especially as
there is no necessity for delay

Item 3^d I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Elizabeth
and during her natural life only one third part of the settlement
of Land which I now have consisting of four hundred and ten
acres of which an estimation is the third (3rd) district of the fourth
Section of Chatsworth at the time of Survey but now Floyd County
and known as number nine Hundred and thirty seven (937)
nine Hundred and thirty eight (938) acre thousand and twenty
and one thousand and eight (1008) and the other situated in the
sixteenth District of said Section and known as number two
eight (28) together with the buildings on said settlement also my
negro Woman Sarah about twenty five years old and my negro
boy Randal about seventeen years old our bed and couch and
the good feather bed and furniture.

Item 4th I give bequeath and devise William L. Simmons in trust for
my daughter Comfort and her heirs the remaining two thirds
of the settlement of land mentioned in the third Item that
who is also to have in the same way the other third at the death
of my wife Elizabeth together with all the negro number and equipment
as thereunto belonging for her and the joint
bequeath to the said William L. Simmons intent for my said
daughter Comfort my negro Woman Dinah about twenty seven
years old my negro boy of yellow complexion known by the
name of Little Bob my horse known by the name of Bill and
her bed and furniture and one cow and calf.

Item 5th I give bequeath and devise to my grand Daughter Anna
Williamson my negro girl Martha about eight years old and an
ox bed and furniture and one cow & calf

Item 6th I give bequeath and devise to my son John Barker
pig for about seven years old and two hundred Dollars in cash

Item 7th I give bequeath and devise to my son John Barker
negro boy Henry about nineteen years old

Item 8th I give and bequeath and devise to Richard J.

in trust for my daughter Abby Summers my negro man
Rob about forty years old and his forty acre lots of land
situated being and being in the third district of the first
section of formerly Chancery now Floyd County and known
in the plan of said district as lots number one thousand one
hundred and one thousand four hundred and
fifty and one thousand five hundred and ten (1510)

Item 9th I will and desire that my Executor herein after to be
appointed to sell my negro boy Jerry and divide the money arising
therefrom equally among the heirs of the body of my deceased
Daughter Annie Williams and also one hundred and fifty
Dollars of the money arising from the sale of my other effects
to make the value as near equal as possible to the other negro
goes off in the above bequests

Item 10th I will and desire that all the residue of my estate
whether it be lands tenements or merchandise either that
has been before disposed of be sold and the money arising from
said sale together with the money arising from the collection
of outstanding debts and cash in hand be equally divided
among my heirs to wit the childrens of my deceased Daughter
Annie Williams to receive one part to be equally divided among
them with the exception of the slave named Hamisha Williams
who is to have only fifty dollars of that part my son John one
part my son Joseph one part Richard S. Summers in trust
as executor for the same and my daughter Abby one
part and William C. Summers in trust for the
use of my daughter Comfort one part.

Item 11th I will and desire that at the death of my beloved
wife before named she negro and other property belong to
her during life in the State of the same except her be sold and
the money arising from said sale be divided equally among
my several heirs as above mentioned

Item 12th I hereby constitute and appoint my Worthy friend
William S. Summers sole Executor of this my last will
and testament and also trustee for my daughter Comfort who
is hereby authorized to change by Sale or otherwise with the
consent of the majority of the property she may receive as such trustee
Item 13th I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Richard S.
Summers trustee for my daughter Abby Summers with like
powers this 9th day of January 1852. Signed

Revoking all others, I make this my last will and Testament
Item 1st I give and bequeath all the lands wherewere I know lies
to my beloved Wife Martha Casow during her natural life
Item 2d it is my Will that my Executor manage my property in
the best way that their judgment may direct and if they disagree
in judgment they shall refer their opinions to my Father Joseph
Harrison and his opinion shall govern my executors on Any question
to him out my Negro or such as can be done to pay my debts and
if need be to sell one or more of my negroes for that purpose and of
my debts one paid I desire that my children be maintained and
educated, of the heir or heiress of their Father and every
child born among them at the age of twenty one years if they desire
I will that they may have a part of my Estate such a part
Executor shall point out the said property to be valued &
