if need be to sell one or more of my negroes for that purpose and of
my debts are paid I desire that my children be maintained &
educated, if the hire of or profits of their Labor and as my
children arrive at the age of twenty one years if they choose
I will that they may have a part of my estate such as they
Executors shall point out the said property to be valued

by them the witnesses for holders under oath and not to
expose their rightful share.

Item 3rd. When my youngest child arrives at the age of twenty one years it is my will that all my property be equally divided in that way that my Executors may determine by throwing it into lots and drawing or by sale and dividing the money amongst all my children mentioning one share to my beloved Wife Martha Carson in addition to the above named Land after taking the advance ment that may have been made to the other children as part or all of their share

Mem^o. If any of my negroes becomes ungovernable and my, Master, think it best to sell them and put off the money at interest in safe hands and good security they are authorized to do so.
