depart this life, do in right and proper both
as respect my family and my self, that I should
make a disposition of the property with which a kind
providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my
last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling
all others heretofore made.
1st I desire and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and christian like manner suitable to my
circumstances and condition in life and I trust
that I return to God who gave it as I hope for salvation
through the merits and atonement of the blessed
Savior and Savior for Christ.
2nd I desire that all my just debts be paid
with out delay by my executor hereafter named
and appointed.
3rd I give bequeath and devise to my Beloved
son John D. Bennett and James S. Bennett my
two sons all the lands and personal property that
may be possessed of at my death and I will all
my wearing apparel to Mary Emily Benton
and I will and devise that Mary Emily Benton
and Elizabeth Benton be paid reasonable for their
troubles with me during the time I shall live in
the home they wait on me.
4th Finally I will and desire that all my
property both real and personal except the
with in excepted, the wearing apparel, be sold
by my executor hereafter appointed, at public
sale by cry and after all debts and all

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legal expenses is paid by my executor that the
remainings of the said estate be equally
divided between my two sons John D. Barnett
and James P. Barnett
