

Last Will and Testament of G. C. Morgan.

State of Georgia } In the name of God - Amen.
Forrest County } I, G. C. Morgan, of said County and
} State, being of advanced age and
being desirous of settling my
worldly affairs while I have strength so to do,
and being of sound and disposing mind and
memory - knowing that I must right shortly
depart this life, deem it right and proper,
both as respects my family and myself, that
I should make a disposition of the property with
which a kind Providence has blessed me,
I do, therefore, make this my last Will and
Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all
others by me heretofore made.

First: I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay, by my
Executors hereinafter named.

Secondly: I will and bequeath to my beloved
wife, Elizabeth Catharine Morgan, my entire
home farm, and one years support, and all
the buildings thereon, except the two shops, wood
and blacksmith, which are to be used as such
as long as they keep good order, and then sub-
ject to be removed by the owners of them,
also, all of household and kitchen furniture

Thirdly: I will and bequeath to my son,
Noah W. Morgan, the Webbord House and lot, and
my half interest in Tan-yard lot, and also
seventy-five Dollars (\$75⁰⁰) in money.

Fourthly: I will and bequeath to my son
John D. Morgan, half interest in Tan-yard lot.

Fifthly: I will and bequeath the remainder
of my individual and Company property, both
real and personal, to be sold either publicly or
privately, as the best ^{interest} of the estate may demand.

said proceeds to be divided as follows:

Sixthly: I will and bequeath to my beloved Daughter, Henrietta P. Williams, One Hundred Dollars (\$100⁰⁰). Also, to Catharine C. Conner, One Hundred Dollars, (100⁰⁰), also, to Mary R. Morgan, Daniel H. Morgan and Virgil R. Morgan, three last mentioned, Two Hundred Dollars each,

Seventhly: I desire and direct the entire remainder of my property be equally divided between the nine lawful heirs.

Eighthly: I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Elizabeth C. Morgan, Guardian for my minor children.

Ninthly: I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Elizabeth C. Morgan, and my Son, John L. Morgan, Executors of this, my last Will and Testament. This May 14th 1880. (Signed) Crawford C. Morgan
