

Will of Phillip Cox.

State of Georgia September the 18th 1882.

Forsyth County } In the name of God. Amen.

I, Phillip Cox, being of sound mind, make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st I commend my soul to God who gave it.Item 2nd I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner.Item 3rd I desire that all my just debts be paid.Item 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Cox, all my property, consisting of Lands, Stock of all kinds, household and kitchen furniture, for and during her natural life. After my wife's death, I desire that my daughters Emily L. Cox, Martha L. Cox and Nancy Savannah Cox, each have one hundred and fifty dollars apiece, before any distribution. Then I bid the remainder to be equally divided between all my children hereafter named as follows.

Marion L. Cox, Samuel L. Cox, Emily L. Cox, Martha L. Cox, Nancy Savannah Cox, Margaret J. Cox, Susan Wallis James A. Cox, John P. Cox and Henry Cox. And I hereby appoint my sons, Marion L. Cox and John P. Cox, my Executors to carry out this will.
