State of Georgia Forsyth County;

In the name of god, Amen. I George H Julian of said State and County, being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper, as respects myself and my family, that I should make this my last Will and Testament, in reference to the disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, hereby revoking and annulling all other Wills and Testaments made by me heretofore.

Item 1st I devise and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, my soul I trust shall return and rest with god who gave it.

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my Just Debts be paid without delay by Executors hereinafter named;

Item 3rd I devise give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Adeline Julian, One Third of all my Estate in (Savannah and Forsyth Counties, having due regard to Quantity and Quality, including the Houses and Outbuildings, one half of my household and Kitchen furniture, One half of all my horse, Mules, oxen, cattle, Hogs, and other stock, and plantation tools, Waggons, Carriages &c and the following Negroes to wit, Dick a man, Lott a woman Abby a woman, Honey a boy and Lewis a Boy, during their natural lives, and at their death the Children and their issue, and the Land

and whatever else of the property named in this Will is still on hand, at her death, is to become the property of my son Abijah Julian, and his heirs, if he should be alive at the time or have any Legitimate children, and if my son Abijah should die Childless before his mother dies then at the death of my wife, Adaline Julian all that property left to her in this Will, to be Equally divided between my Brothers and Sisters.

Item 4th I devise give and bequeath unto my son Abijah Julian, Two Thirds of all the Lands & parcels in Dawson and Harrold Counties having due regard to Quality and Quantity, and one half of my house hold and Kitchen furniture, one half of all my horses, Mules, Oxen cattle, hogs & other stock, and plantation tools, waggons carriages &c, and the following Negroes, viz, Ellick a Boy Jim a Boy, David a Boy, & Nelson a Boy.

5th Item I desire that my present growing crop, and all the corn, wheat, and other provisions & forage now on hand be Equally divided between my wife Adaline Julian & my son Abijah Julian.

6th Item I desire that that the following Negroes viz, Lizzie a woman & her a boy, Jane a girl and George a boy, and all the rest of my property, not mentioned in the foregoing part of this Will, be sold, and the proceeds, together with all my money and what may be collected, be used in the payment of my Debts, and if there is anything over, the payment of my last Debts, that it should be loaned on Interest, until my son Abijah Julian comes of age, and then that it should belong to him and last Item, having full confidence in my beloved wife, Adaline Julian I leave her my special
