of Forsyth County and State aforesaid being of
an advanced age, knowing the uncertainty
of life deems it right & proper both as
respect myself and my family to make a disposition
of the property wth which a kind Providence
has blessed me.

Wherefore I hereby make this my last will
and testament revoking all others hereto
fore made by me.

Item 1^o I desire that my body be buried in
my family grave yard near the residence
of Mr. Williams of said County in
Christian like manner suitable to my cir-
cumstances.

Item 2^o I Direct that all my just debts be paid by
my proper representatives herein after named
without any unnecessary delay & that all be
due me be collected in as early as convenient

Item 3^o I give to my beloved wife Harriet Mc-
Refie lot of land etc. on which I
may live together with all of the buildings
orchards and other appurtenances theron
also fraction of ten acres more or less
lying broad side & joining said lot with
South of said fraction described in the
of H Thompsons Deed to me; also my
big house named Ephraim also my new
Boggy harness also my new Wagons
harness the white one always made
& piled up no pine a broad fence

the side saddle one plow Stock, set plow & man
a certain white heifer now about ten months
old also all the Household and Kitchen furni-
ture not hereinafter disposed of in this will
also twelve months supplies out of the corn lura-
mats and other provisions that I may have on
hand at the time of my death.

Item 4.

I give to my daughter Margaret McCafee
the cow & calf, Bedsteads, & Bed furniture
as she has now in possession Also all her
Crockery ware which she has of her own

Item 5.

I give my son John McCafee the horse
called Philo which he has now in posse-
sion together with my Saddle & bridle also
lot of land or adjoining lands
of Mr Hallman farms & Blackstock; also
one Cow and Calf or money enough for
purchase a Cow and Calf; One plough Stock
set plough gear and plows one sow & pigs
if no pigs are born, sow one cloke and
face my carpenters tools.

Item 6.

I direct that after all the above property
is given off as specified than my
town lots in the town of Newnan
Give to my remaining lot off land one
together with all off the remainder of
my personal property not given off
by lots by my representatives & the
proceeds arising therefrom be equal
divided among all my children
by my first and last wife and if
any die before their legal time to
receive their part my wife to be
an equal heir with my children

Item 7

I hereby appoint my beloved wife Harriet A. McCafe my executrix & my nephew Elijah McCafe my executor of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto signed my name & set my seal while of sound disposing mind and memory June 25th 1865.

Codicil

I wish what Confederate money I have on hand at my death to be equally divided between all my children & my wife as specified in Item 6 & further that if any of my heirs as enumerated in Item 6th become dissatisfied with the distribution I have made and attack or undertake to break this under them then one or more to undertake to undertake to settle the same under my hand & seal by law in our presence.
