Will of William Page.

In the name of God, Amen - In the year of
Lord, one Thousand eight hundred and fifty six,
County of Forsyth and State of Georgia I, William
Page, Gentlemen - Being through the blessings of God
a sound state of mind and memory, but bal-
to mind the frail tenure of life, and that it is
to all men once to die, do make and ordain
my last Will and Testament, that is to say, prin-
and first of all, I recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God, who give it me, and the disposal
my body I leave to the entire discretion of my friends

With respects to my worldly estate, I give bequeath
and dispose of it in the manner and proportions
following. First I give and bequeath to my daughter
Jane Cook two dollars and to my son Benjamin
two dollars and to ^{my son} ~~my~~ Green W. Page two dollars,
to my daughter Mary Brown one yd and two c
linpans, one white double wove Cornlupham m
grounded, and two quilts, and to my daughter
Whitehead, two dollars, and to my son Nathaniel Pa
dollars and one wash pot that he has in his pos-
and my daughter Fecimiah Gans two dollars.
Finally I give and bequeath unto my much lov-
son William J Page, whom I make my sole execu-
this my last will and Testament, all and sing-
my Lands, tenements, tenements and furniture
with the exception above made, for I authorize, my
William J Page, to pay over and deliver the
same after my death, and I do hereby
revoke, and disannul all and sing-

in any way before named, witha, and by executing
ratifying and confirming this and no other
my last will and Testament, in witness where
