Will of William Page.

In the name of God, Amen - In the year of
Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty six,
County of Forsyth and State of Georgia I, William
Page, Gentleman - Being through the blessings of God
in a sound state of mind and memory, but being
to mind the frail tenure of life, and that it is
to all men once to die, do make and ordain
my last Will and Testament, that is to say, first
and first of all, I recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God, who give it me, and the disposal
of my body I leave to the entire discretion of my friends.

With respects to my worldly estate, I give begin
and dispose of it in the manner and proportion
following. First I give and bequeath to my dear
wife Cook two dollars and to my son Benjamin
two dollars, and to ^{my son} Green W. Page two dollars,
to my daughter Mary Brown one Dsd and two C
terpans, one white double wovc Counterpan one
grindled and two quilts, and to my daughter
Whitehead, two dollars, and to my son Nathaniel P.
two dollars and one wash pot that he has in his pos-
session my daughter Feminia Gano two dollars.
Finally I give and bequeath unto my much bel-
oved son William G. Page, whom I make my sole tenu-
ee this my last will and Testament, all and singular
my lands, messuages, tenements and possessions
with the exception above made, for & Anthony, my
son William G. Page to pay over and deliver to
me and my heirs after my death, and I do hereby
revoke and disannul all and every former
Testament and Supersedeas.
