and being writing also containing all my estate of
hereof

I the 1st of November in the year 1856, who gave it
with cash my money to be buried in the year
1856 and gave it to my plantation
1856

It is to note that the expenses of the
my burial together with all my just
debt be paid, without delay
1856

I do give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Sarah H Burrup seven hundred
dollars in money together with her bed
and bed clothes all that she has made
also my buggy and also one by name
man, well
1856

I give and bequeath to my grand son Henry
Clay Burrup fifteen hundred dollars in
money to be taken out of the distribution
I have left his father John H Burrup in my will
also I give and bequeath to my son John
Henry Clay Burrup one entire negro boy
slave of yellow complexion named
Casper near a letter one, one
year, also out of my general estate
I desire and desire my plantation
to pay over said money and then
I want said negro boy to be paid to my
son John H Burrup

When I being appointed trustee for his said son Henry
Clay Burrup during his minority said trustee giving
other security to pay over said Henry's portion hundred
dollar bank fund over to my depts for said Henry
Clay Burrup when he should become twenty one years
old said John H Burrup to have the use of said
money and to pay during said minority of
Henry Clay Burrup without interest or charge
raising and educating his said son till he came
of age.

Item 5 It is my will that all the rest of my
property be equally divided between all my children to
wits not to be sold, leased or otherwise disposed of the share of
Stemmel Beck Ball to go to her sole and separate use
and subject to the control & disposal of her present
or any future husband, and to be made for the
use of her and her children, also the share in part
of Martha S Brooks to go to her sole and separate use
and subject to the control & disposal of her present
or any future husband, and to be made for the use
of her and her children to account in the division
for the property I have hereafter advanced, with
a list of which will be found attached to this will
my son John Henry Burrup to be equal with to it
after the amount given to his son Henry Clay Burrup
in the 4th item is taken.

Item 6 I do hereby appoint my son John H Burrup
and my three son Thomas Jacob H Burrup Sherman &
Hunt to and them to take any real estate I own
after my last will and testament
to wit the land whereof I have heretofore let
said land affixed by Dec. 9th Feb. 1861
