

Last Will of William Wallis.

State of Georgia: I, William Wallis, of said State
Forsyth County, and County, being of sound and
disposing mind and memory, do
make this, my last will and
Testament.

Item first: I will and direct that as soon
as possible after my death, that my beloved
Wife, Eliza Wallis, shall have One thousand dollars
in money, as her share of my estate, and that
the said sum of One thousand dollars, be controlled
by my Executor hereinafter named, and that he
put said sum out on interest, and that Real
Estate be bound for the said money, and that the
interest arising from said money be paid over by
my Executor, to my Son David Wallis, yearly, for the
support and comfort of my Wife Eliza Wallis, or
as much as is necessary for her comfort. And if she
does not need the full amount of the yearly interest
the remainder be added to the Principal, and let
out as the same. And if, from sickness or other
cause, she should need more than the interest,
my Executor shall see that she has enough out
of the Principal for her support and comfort.
And at my said wife's death, all the money that
is left for her, that remains at her death, be divided
equally between my heirs as the other property,
hereafter named. This bequest is made to my
said wife Eliza Wallis, in lieu of her whole
Dower.

Item second: I will that all my property,
both real and personal, that remains after the
amount stated in Item first, and after the payment
of all debts and necessary expenses of carrying out
this Will, be equally divided between my Sons,
James J. Wallis, John M. Wallis, Harvey C. Wallis,

David Wallis, Henry L. Wallis, William J. Wallis, and George L. Wallis, and my Daughters, Nancy A. Martin and Eliza J. Garrison. And that William L. and James R. Wallis, heirs of my son James Wallis, deceased, shall have their father's share, which share shall be equal with my other heirs.

Item third: I will and direct that my heirs mentioned in Item second have the right to divide, without sale, all of my effects, both real and personal, that is left to them, if it can be done satisfactory to all concerned, if not, to be sold as the Law directs in such cases, and the proceeds be divided between my heirs as mentioned in Item second.

Item fourth: I hereby constitute and appoint my friend, Thomas A. Hardin, Executor to carry out this, my last Will and Testament,
