

Last Will and Testament of John Wofford.

Georgia Forsyth County June 2d 1874:

In the name of God, Amen! In the County of Forsyth being mindful of my mortality do this 2d day of June in year of our Lord 1874 Make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following:

First I desire to be decently and privately buried in the churchyard at Concord Church without any funeral pomp and with as little expense as may be. Also I give and bequeath unto my wife Jane Wofford the sum of my property after my just debts is paid the property as follows One hundred acres of land lying and being in the County of said No as follows lot No (361) (43) and for of lot No (316) lying and being in the eighth hundredth Seventy eighth Dec 3d 1874 Jane Wofford is to hold and use this property as she may see proper during her widowhood or life time and at her death this property is to be equal divided among the heirs what is on hand at her death, I also do appoint John B. McBrayer to carry out my will, In witness whereof we have set hand & Seal.

executed by him and without persuasion force or any undue influence
whatever so far as witness knows.

I George Kellogg of the County and State aforesaid,
being of sound mind and memory, and desiring to
settle my worldly affairs, do make, ordain and publish this my
last will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made
by me.

Item 1st

I commit my Soul to God, who gave it, and I desire my body buried
in the graveyard at Ebenezer Church in said County, in a plain and the
customary manner, my grave to be marked with a head and foot
stone of good fine white marble, with the simple inscription of
my age and name.

Item 2^d

I desire all my just debts to be paid by my Executors hereinafter
appointed.

Item 3^d

I give to my son Henry C. Kellogg, the one undivided fourth
interest in and to one undivided sixth of Lot of Land No 1113 in
the 1st Dist. & 2^d section of Cherokee County, also the one
