Item 1 I give and bequeath to my dear & beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life one hundred dollars a year to be paid to her by my Executors also three Negroes to wit Phillis, Clarissa & Louisa also three beds & furniture: One mill and cart all of which is to be disposed of at her death as hereinafter provided for except the beds & furniture which is to be at her own disposal -

Item 2 I give and bequeath unto my grand Daughter Avaline Burton daughter of John H. Burton four Negroes to wit Billy and her three children Leardine Ben & Jack the said Negroes to go in to the possession of John Morris & his wife to be held by them until the said Avaline be come of age or marries the said John & his wife to board & clothe & educate the said Avaline for the use of said Negroes as above stated & I would prefer the said Avaline would live with the said John & his wife until she arrives at age or marries

Item 3 I give and bequeath unto the children of my son David Harrison all that part of the Tract of Land whereon I now live that lies on the South side of the River except what I have heretofore given off to John H. Burton also one Negro girl named Phillis also one bed & three & furniture & one desk and Bureau & one clay Bank more and her Colt & one sword by two years old

Item 4 I give and bequeath unto my son in law Larkin Harrison one Negro woman named Nancy and to the children of my daughter Francis Harrison I give & bequeath

I give and bequeath unto Ann & Oliver I also
give to James Warrison daughter of the said
Francis Warrison one Negro child named
Manda

Item 5th I Give and bequeath unto my son in law
Tabron Harlow one Negro woman named
Anna and one tract of land containing
three hundred acres more or less as conveyed
to me by - Fowler adjoining William
St Chamblis on the waters of Stails Creek

Item 6 I Give and bequeath unto my son in law
John Morris one Negro boy named Solomon

Item 7 I Give and bequeath unto my grand
Benjamin St Barton one Negro boy named
Job

Item 8 I Give and bequeath to the two sons of my
deceased daughter Elvira Caldwell for
hundred dollars to be paid in the hands
of John Morris to be paid to them when
they arrive at age or sooner if he thinks
it will be prudent to do so And to the
Infant daughter of the said Elvira I give
and bequeath one Negro girl named
Jane & in case the said Chila should
die in her minority the girl Jane is to
be the property of my daughter Polly
Morris

Item 9 I give and bequeath unto my niece Harriet
Warrison all the title and interest I have
in & to two hundred acres of land more
or less on the waters of Light House Log
Creek as conveyed to me by John St Pay

Item It is my will that the balance of my estate
both real and personal (including that
portion given to my wife in my will
which is not to be sold until after
my death after paying the foregoing

all just debts to be
 paid in such manner and at such
 times and places as my Executors or
 think best and the proceeds to be
 equally divided between the following
 Children to wit John B Harrison
 John Morris David Dumas Elvira
 Burton and Elizabeth Calvethon It
 is my will that the said Elizabeth
 Calvethon have out of the above
 twelve hundred dollars in addition
 to her distributive Share

Item 11 It is my will that if my son Lerold
 Harrison should within ten years from
 this time relieve himself from the judg-
 ments that are now against him that
 the property given to his children in
 the third section of this will shall
 belong to and be the property of the
 said Lerold instead of his children
 as provided for in said section

Item 12 I give to the children of my son
 Lerold S Harrison the one sixth
 part of my present crop
 And lastly I do hereby constitute and app-
 oint my son John B Harrison & my
 son in law John Morris & David Dumas
 Executors to this my last will & testament
 hereby Revoking all former wills by me made
 hereby Ratifying and confirming this my last
 will & Testament in testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand & seal this 28th day
 of July 1842 signed in a legal
