I also lend to my wife Nancy all my Household Furniture, all my stock of Horses + cattle, + hogs, and all my working tools during her life, or widowhood - at that period the negro named ~~Charles~~ I give to my son Charles Colyer Clayton, and the rest of the property to be equally divided amongst all my children. My land to be sold, to pay my debts and to make an equal division of the above mentioned property, my beloved wife Nancy + my son Charles Colyer Clayton whom I ~~heretofore~~ make, constitute, or dain the sole Executor + Executor of this my last will and Testament. Heretofore given, Ratifying + confirming this and no other to be my last will + Testament.
