Franklin County and State aforesaid, being of
sound & disposing mind & memory do make Con-
-stitute & Ordain this my last will & Testament, revoking
all other - 1st In the first place, I wish all my
personal or perishable property (except one Horse to
be disposed of hereafter) to be sold, within the
time prescribed by law, in such cases, & the money
thence arising, or so much thereof as is necessary
to be applied to the payment of all the just debts
that I owe, as well as any expenses that I may
incur during my last illness Funeral expenses
& so forth. - 2nd It is my wish that all my
Real Estate, (viz) lands or other property whatever
be sold for the benefit of my Children, and I
do hereby authorize my Executors hereafter to be
named, and vest in them full power to dispose
of the same in any manner they may deem most
advantageous, either by private Contract, or
at public Auction.

3rd I leave to my son Andrew Dorsey a certain
bay Gelding, known by the name of Myck, over
and above his share of my estate, and shall
not operate to exclude him from inheriting an
equal share of my other estate -

4th After my Executors have made sale of all my
property both real and personal, and have dis-
-charged all just debts that I owe, and col-
-lected the several debts that is or may be com-
-due, It is my wish that an equal division be
made of the money remaining in their hands
between all my Children, and their several
or respective portions or shares to be delivered
to them, when they respectively arrive at in-
-evitable age or marriage -

5th And lastly I do hereby constitute and ordain
my friends John Dorsey & Olias Baker
